Another project we have in our hearts is in Paraguay, South America. We will be taking a team in June to complete the construction of the Susannah Wesley School in Quinta Linea, Paraguay.

We are excited to see how this project has grown & developed to this point! This has been a tremendous blessing to the adjacent church,

which has also been expanded by a Korean team. God has been good in Quinta Linea!
