We reported last month that Ed had joined Engineers Without Borders. This month was his first trip with the group – to Haiti. Ed went with 4 others from the USA, their job was to repair a water system in the small, northeastern village of Los Palis. It was also the first time that Ed had flown with Missionary Air Fellowship (MAF). They took a short hop in a 5 seat single engine airplane from Port au Prince to Hinche, near Los Palis. Here is Ed with the pilot,

Brother Mark who has been in Haiti for 15 years and endured 4 evacuations, returning after each one!

The village of Los Palis has about 150 homes and the sole water system is fed by a spring up in the mountains. Our goal was to add a chlorinator to the system but upon arriving we found the water was not flowing from the spring to the village. So our focus changed to getting water to the folks that have been enduring an abnormally long dry season without potable water. The family below is getting water from a leak in the pipe.





We are always awed by the work that God has blessed us with, being able to work with no borders!
