It's always a blessing to spend Thanksgiving with our family. This year, we celebrated the first birthday of our youngest grandson, Gage. His

This project was finished in March, 2011, by our drilling friends with Amigos for Christ. with us that about 15 to 20 families are able to use the clean water from the well. With about 5 persons per family, that's 75 to 100 people the Pastors are able to evangelize. To God be the Glory!
