The members of the committee indicated that the well is contaminated. most likely from infiltration of animal waste and other surface activities.

We finished a well project in Nicaragua. It was a "Skype/E-Mail" well! Colleagues Angi & Ronnie Hopkins, serving in Nicaragua, contacted us about the needs of a small community named San Diego in Nueva Segovia. The community has a well established Community Health Evangelism Committee (CHE), which had identified the need for a clean water source as top priority. We were contacted, and were able to pull together a driller, a group to oversee the project, and funding. Funding for the project came from Fairview UMC, Maryville, TN and from an individual donor.

The photo on the right is the new well at San Diego. The CHE leaders are Darling & Jose Ramirez. The original plans were to install a 1,000 gallon tank, with a 2-3 hp pump. This should provide



water for 18 homes. However, the Ramirez's & leaders still have dreams to extend the water to 70 homes. Pray for their success.

We love to see how believers gather to worship, however that may look. This month we took a short trip to Texas to visit Linda's sister, Judy Grounds. Judy's husband passed away in February, but we didn't get to attend his services. While there, we worshiped at Triple Cross Cowboy Church. This church has different family activities. 


The Things We Learned!
