We currently have 3 different projects we're working with. We are praying for continued support for the orphanage in Liberia. We want this to be a matching fund project with the orphanage Board. Most of you know that our adopted "Home Country" is Paraguay. We ask for your prayers for the people of both Paraguay & Brazil as they are experiencing severe flooding from the Parana River & the Paraguay River. Those of you who have come to Paraguay and on to Iguazu Falls may remember how beautiful these Falls are. The above photo is from June 12th.

Also, the Paraguay River, next to the capital city of Asuncion, is at 23.4 ft. depth. This has caused much flooding and evacuation of many neighborhoods along the riverbank—which is in downtown Asuncion. From our experience in Paraguay, when this type of flooding happens, it is a disaster as the sewer system of the country cannot handle this amount of water. This will also mean the rise of both mosquito born diseases as well as water born diseases.



Children are most effected in these areas, so please pray for all the people of Paraguay.

Being water well drillers, we always gravitate to water wells, where ever we find them. Recently



we were visiting an active plantation near Eatonton, GA. The plantation was established in the late 1780's, and has been a viable plantation since that time. This water well is still being used. We were told it tastes great! We were even given an old timey wooden dipper to try it out. We passed on that opportunity, but so glad to see an older well still in use.

Transition—"The process or a period of changing from one state or condition to another" Transition is something we have experienced many time—US to Costa Rica to Paraguay to Nicaragua to US. It may sound strange, but the most difficult transition we've experienced is from Nicaragua to US. Why? Well, in 10 years, many things have changed in the US. Yes, we did come back every year to visit our children & grandchildren; but that's not the same. Many things are still amazing us, but the auto dispensing in public bathrooms are still perplexing! We were recently visiting a friend in the hospital. Linda, went in to the



public restroom, and noticed there was no hook for her purse. Not wanting to set the purse on the floor (we were in a hospital!), she set it in a perfectly dry sink. YES—the auto dispensing water just started pouring INTO her purse! She got her cell phone out after just a few drops, but the inside of her purse

was soaked. Now, have folks in the US not been able to operate a sink, toilet, paper towel dispenser without automation? This transition is very strange!

Transition does give us a change for reflection. At The Mission Society, we are encouraged to write a Ministry & Growth Plan—looking at where we've been, where we are now, & where we're going. As such, we've decided to live a quieter life. We've recently moved out of the big city of Lawrenceville (Atlanta suburb) to Eatonton, GA, on Lake Sinclair. It's only about a 90 minute drive from one place to another, but that drives takes you through Georgia's dairy country as well as Georgia's lake country. Our only noise at night is the "talking" of the frogs to each other.
