Science, Technology, Engineering, & Mathematics

This is the program we were involved with at Radloff Middle School in Gwinnett County, GA.

The STEM program is defined "as an integrated curriculum (as opposed to science, technology, engineering, and mathematics taught in isolation) that is driven by problem solving, discovery, exploratory project/problem-based learning, and student-centered development of ideas and solutions."

kids how many feet are in a mile or what is meant when we say a pH of 9? These kids know the answers! We gave them a brief presentation about water needs in 3rd world countries. We then took them outside for a hands on carrying water exercise. We think most of the kids found

the exercise harder than they expected. Back in the classroom, we continued discussing water needs & how these needs may be met in different countries. For 2 hrs. these kids were engaged & on task. Proud of the youth of today!
